Notes on completing the ICC application form

Evidencing your identity and eligibility

The UK ICC issued by the RYA is issued in conformity with Resolution No. 40. It is intended for UK Nationals and UK residents i.e. people who are settled in the UK and whose primary residence is in the UK.

The RYA will also issue the ICC to nationals of other countries that have not adopted Resolution No. 40 because they may otherwise be unable to obtain an ICC. However should the relevant country later adopt Resolution No. 40, the certificate holder will no longer be eligible to have an ICC issued by the RYA and will not be able to amend or renew that certificate.

Unless the applicant is resident in the UK, the UK ICC issued by the RYA is **not available** to the nationals of the following countries that have currently adopted Resolution No. 40: **Austria, Belarus, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czechia, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Switzerland and Ukraine. This list (correct at 01/10/2020) is subject to change.**

Warning:

If you are a national of a country that has adopted Resolution No. 40 and were issued with an ICC by the RYA before that country adopted Resolution No. 40 you will not be able to amend or renew your ICC. You must return the certificate to the RYA and you will not be entitled to any refund.

If you are a national of a country that has adopted Resolution No. 40 and were issued with an ICC by the RYA because you were resident in the UK but you have ceased to be resident in the UK you will not be able to amend or renew your ICC. If your details change you must return the certificate to the RYA and you will not be entitled to any refund.

It is the applicant's responsibility to check that they are eligible to be issued with the ICC before undertaking any training courses, tests or assessments with a view to obtaining an ICC.

When processing an ICC application the RYA must verify the applicant's identity and nationality. All applicants must provide copies of a document or a combination of documents with their ICC application, which together verify their identity (name, address, date of birth, photograph) and their nationality. If an applicant later asks to have the certificate amended, documentary evidence which verifies the updated information must be provided.

Each document must contain the information that it is being used to verify and must not have expired. A full translation must be provided for any document which is not written in English. If the RYA is not satisfied with the documentation provided an ICC will not be issued.

In the Evidence of applicant's identity and nationality section in part 1 of the ICC application form you need to indicate which documents you are enclosing to verify each element of your identity (name, address, date of birth, photograph) and your nationality. If you do not have a passport and / or a driving licence you can send any of the documents details in the table above.

Dual nationality

If you have dual nationality and at least one of those nationalities is of a country that has not yet adopted Resolution 40 (i.e. it is not listed above), you can apply for an ICC as long as you can provide the required evidence of your nationality and identity. If you are dual national and both countries have adopted Resolution 40, then you will only be able to apply for a UK ICC issued by the RYA if you are resident in the UK.

Please make sure that you understand the warning above regarding changes to residency status and the situation when countries adopt Resolution No. 40.

In order for your nationality to appear on your certificate, you must provide evidence that you have that nationality, as detailed in the RYA's table of documents that can be used to verify identity and nationality for the issue of the ICC. If you would like both nationalities to be shown on your certificate you will need to provide separate documentary evidence (as detailed above) which verifies each nationality.

A second nationality can be added to an existing ICC if you provide documentary evidence (as detailed above) for the nationality you wish to be added to your ICC.

Making changes to your ICC

If you change your name, address, or nationality, please complete the ICC application form indicating that you are requesting an amendment to an ICC which is still valid by ticking the updating details box at the top of the first page. You will need to return your current certificate and provide documentary evidence which verifies the updated information in accordance with the table above.

If you need to add additional categories to an existing ICC, you will need to provide evidence of your competence for those categories. Further information can be found in part 3 of the ICC application form.

Replacing a lost ICC

If you have lost your certificate, you can apply to the RYA for a replacement using the ICC Application Form. In order for the certificate to be re-issued you will need to provide the evidence of your identity and nationality that is required for a new ICC application.

The certificate will be re-issued with the expiry date that is recorded on our database and for the categories of vessel and types of water that are recorded on our database. If you wish to have any categories that are not recorded on our database validated on the certificate, you will need to provide evidence of your competence for those categories. Further information can be found in <u>part 3 of the ICC application form</u>.

Renewing your certificate

If you are renewing your certificate and you are requesting a new certificate with the same name, address, date of birth, and nationality as are printed on your expiring certificate, you can submit your expiring certificate as proof of your identity and nationality.

If any of your details have changed since your expiring certificate was issued, you must provide your documentary evidence which verifies the updated information.

If you are unable to supply your expiring certificate you will need to provide the evidence of your identity and nationality that is required for a new ICC application.

Notes on completing the ICC application form

Evidencing your competence

In order to be issued with a UK ICC by the RYA, you must provide evidence of your competence for each category you would like your ICC to be valid for. You can do this by presenting an eligible RYA or MCA practical course completion certificate or certificate of competence. If you already have the required level of competence, but you don't have an acceptable certificate, you do not need to complete a training course. You can take the ICC Assessment to demonstrate your competence.

It is perfectly acceptable to be assessed for one category and present a certificate for another category. To validate all the categories on an ICC, you will need to be assessed on or present an eligible RYA or MCA practical course completion certificate or certificate of competence to cover each category.

The table on the following page details which categories will be validated by which certificates, tests or assessments.

An ICC cannot be issued unless evidence for a category in list A and a category in list B in the table on the next page is submitted with part 1 of the ICC application form.

List A - Validating the type of vessel categories

Power

Depending on the certificate you present or the assessment you have passed the validity of this category may be restricted to vessels up to 10m length overall (LOA).

Sail (including auxiliary engine)

All ICCs issued with the sail category validated also have the power category validated for vessels up to 10m LOA to allow the holder to drive a tender with an outboard engine.

Personal Watercraft

The ICC assessment is not applicable to Personal Watercraft. If you wish to have the Personal Watercraft category validated on your ICC you must present an RYA Personal Watercraft Proficiency Course Completion Certificate. This is the only certificate that will validate the Personal Watercraft category on an ICC.

List B - Validating the coastal and /or inland category

The ICC does not distinguish between tidal and non-tidal coastal waters and Resolution No. 40 does not set out a comprehensive definition of what is meant by "coastal" and "inland" but the intention is that they are mutually exclusive – i.e. "coastal" is anything that is not "inland".

Resolution No. 40 requires that candidates for coastal waters have knowledge of the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREGs) and candidates for inland waters have knowledge of the traffic regulations applicable on inland waters, in particular the European inland waterways regulations - the Code Européen des Voies de Navigation Intérieure (CEVNI).

Coastal Waters

As detailed in the table (see next page) many RYA practical course completion certificates and RYA/MCA certificates of competence will validate the coastal waters category. This is the case if the course syllabus includes COLREGS, IALA buoyage, navigation and pilotage. Assessment must include the coastal waters aspects of the syllabus.

Inland Waters

CEVNI is not covered in the UK's practical courses, as these regulations are not in use in the UK. Every candidate wishing to have the inland category validated on their ICC must therefore first pass the ICC CEVNI test. This is required by Resolution No. 40 and is the case irrespective of whether the regulations are in force in the country or on the river, lake or canal where you intend to go boating.

Applicants who only have an eligible RYA or MCA certificate which does not validate the coastal waters category or who take an inland ICC assessment, must pass the ICC CEVNI test to receive an ICC, as the certificate would otherwise be invalid.

Check which categories will be validated by which certificates, tests or assessments.

Note: You must provide evidence of your competence for each category you would like your ICC to be valid for. This must include evidence for a category in list A and a category in list B otherwise an ICC cannot be issued. You only require this part of the application form if you are taking an ICC assessment or the CEVNI test at an RYA recognised training centre or an RYA affiliated club.

The ICC assessment of competence is only applicable to applicants without acceptable UK Certificates as listed in <u>part 3 of the ICC application form</u> and it is not applicable to the Personal Watercraft category.
